
Dissemination event: Explaining Population Trends in Cardiovascular Risk



The <u>Division of Health Systems and Public Health</u> at Stellenbosch University is organising a research dissemination and knowledge sharing event to launch the finding of the project, <u>Explaining Population Trends in Cardiovascular Risk: A Comparative Analysis of Health Transitions in South Africa and England (ExPoSE).</u>

The project, which is led by <u>Dr Kafui Adjaye-Gbewonyo</u> of the University of Greenwich and Dr <u>Annibale Cois</u> of Stellenbosch University uses nationally-representative population surveys to examine and explain trends in cardiovascular risk in South Africa and England from 1998 to 2017. The project is also producing a harmonised dataset, code and a data dashboard which will be made publicly available for other researchers and practitioners to use, and these will be showcased during the event.

The event will be held on the 11th of August at the Stellenbosch Institute for Advanced Study (Stias) Wallenberg Research Centre, 10 Marais Road, Stellenbosch, South Africa, from 9 AM to 4 PM, and the possibility of remote participation (via Microsoft Teams) will also be provided.
